

Uninstalling McAfee software from Macs

There are three ways to uninstall McAfee from Macs. They are listed in order from uninstalling the most recent version to the oldest supported version.

- If you already have a copy of the Saint Mary's McAfee software on your computer, you can install the newest version of McAfee and it will automatically replace it.
- If you already have a copy of the Saint Mary's McAfee software on your computer and it isn't working, uninstalling McAfee, restarting the computer, and reinstalling McAfee would be the best course of action.
- If you have a copy of the Saint Mary's McAfee software installed on your computer and you are about to upgrade your operating system to a difference version (i.e. El Capitan to Sierra), we recommend that you uninstall McAfee, restart your computer, and then install the latest version of McAfee available.

Option 1:

- Open Terminal (it should be in the Applications folder in the Utilities folder).
- Type in the following (we recommend copying and pasting):
`sudo /usr/local/McAfee/uninstall EPM`
- Type in the computer's administrator password when prompted - you will not see the cursor move as you type the password.
- When the uninstallation is complete, restart the computer.

Option 2:

- Open Terminal (it should be in the Applications folder in the Utilities folder).
- Type in the following (we recommend copying and pasting):
`sudo /Library/McAfee/cma/uninstall.sh`
- Type in the computer's administrator password when prompted - you will not see the cursor move as you type the password.
- When the uninstallation is complete, restart the computer.

Option 3:

- Open Terminal (it should be in the Applications folder in the Utilities folder).
- Type in the following (we recommend copying and pasting):
`/usr/local/McAfee/uninstallMSC`
- Type in the computer's administrator password when prompted - you will not see the cursor move as you type the password.
- When the uninstallation is complete, restart the computer.
